National pay negotiations

The national pay negotiations for non-clinical staff continue. At the third and final meeting UCEA made a final offer which guarantees increases of at least 1.5% to the pay spine, with higher percentage uplifts to pay points below national spine point 22.

Following the final offer, the trade unions have undertaken their respective processes to consider their responses and have invoked the New JNCHES dispute resolution process. Dispute resolution meetings took place in July.

The University remains committed to implementing the outcome of these national negotiations. The Reward website will be updated as the negotiations progress.

Additional Bank Holiday 2022

The Government has announced that the late May bank holiday in 2022 has been moved to Thursday 2 June and an additional day's holiday has been awarded on **Friday 3 June** to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

This extra day will be granted by the University as additional holiday entitlement.
